Dr. M. Foscue Brock's dedication to healing made a positive impression on all who were lucky enough to know him.



In the 1930s, Dr. M. Foscue Brock began working for our community. The North Carolina native took on the challenge of caring for some of the region's most gravely ill patients at Norfolk's Grandy Sanatorium and the Henry A. Wise Hospital for Contagious Diseases. He battled conditions such as tuberculosis and polio without the help of modern antibiotics, vaccines or even penicillin.



Now, the family is honoring Dr. Brock's legacy with a \$3 million gift that will establish the M. Foscue Brock Institute for Community and Global Health at EVMS — a program that is designed to sharpen the school's focus on Hampton Roads' most pressing health needs and deepen the lifelong commitment to service among EVMS faculty, staff, students and residents.

Dr. Brock cared about the well-being of people in his community, and he instilled that same commitment in his three children. His son, Macon F. Brock Jr., and Macon's wife, Joan, live that tradition by generously supporting programs and organizations that profoundly and positively impact our region.
