



Economic Impact of EVMS

In February 2012, noted regional economist James V. Koch, PhD, reported on his evaluation of the school's imprint on the regional economy. He found that EVMS-related economic activity grew at nearly three times the rate of the region since 2007. He estimated the school's annual impact at \$824 million and indicated it could have grown to nearly \$1 billion were it not for the recession.


